The Shangjunshu 商君書 "Book of Lord Shang", also called Shangzi 商子 "Master Shang" or Shangjun 商君 "Lord Shang", was written by Gongsun Yang 公孫陽 or Wei Yang 魏陽, the Lord of Shang 商 (390-338 BCE), a title which also gave him the name Shang Yang 商鞅, by which he is commonly known today. Of the original 29 chapters, only 24 are extant.
